

## EAST ASIAN EDUCATION PROJECT

### Chronology, July 1 - December 31, 1977

- July 1, 1977: Beginning of Project year.
- July, 1977: NEH/CEC Summer Teacher Training Institute. 10 classroom teachers, one principal, one asst. principal. The Institute includes school year follow-through for 665 students.
- July - December 1977: Kyoto-Boston joint exhibit development.
- July 16, 1977: Bon Odori Festival celebration at "Summer Wharf." 3000 people attended. Broadcast on commercial television.
- July 16, 17, 1977: "Oriental Calligraphy" exhibit at The Wharf, Boston. 5000 people.
- July, August, 1977: 4 Museum Education Interns specialized in Japanese Culture.
- Fall, 1977: Experiments in History Teaching, pp. 23, 113, published and disseminated to several thousand educators.
- October - December, 1977: Curriculum development for ESAA Tri-Arts. Program begins January, 1978.
- October - January 4, 1978: 2 Museum Education Interns specialized in Japanese Culture.
- October 1 - December 23, 1977: "636" in-school course on China for 2 teachers, 2 parent-aids, 80 kids at the Wheatley Middle School, Boston.
- October - December, 1977: Development of trip to China for 35 kids, 5 teachers from Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School, O'Keefe Technical High School, Framingham. Trip will occur February, 1978.
- October 6, 1977: Annual Open House at the Resource Center. 200 teachers and community agency staff attended.  
"Bamboo" exhibit open to the public 6 days a week.

- October 13 - November 17, 1977: Teaching About China, a six-session course for teachers. 9 participants teaching 500 kids.
- October 15, 1977: New England Council of the Association for Asian Studies meeting; Amherst, Ma. Panel presentation "Asian Teaching Units for Non-Asian courses" was attended by 25 teachers. The Project mounted an exhibit for the "Curriculum Fair."
- October 16, 17, 1977: Office of Education Conference for Center Directors and Outreach Coordinators.
- July, October, December, 1977: Development of program for Asian outreach Conference to be held just prior to AAS meetings in March, 1978.
- October 19, 1977: Explorations: Jananese Culture for 2 teachers, 17 students from Newton Country Day of the Sacred Heart.
- October 20, 1977: Boston-Kyoto Sister City Foundation Education Committee Meeting attended by 37 people.
- October - December, 1977: China Club, Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School. 20 participants.
- October - December, 1977: Development of Asian component for NEH Libraries Project.
- November 16, 1977: Slide talk on People's Republic of China for 50 adults.
- November 28, 1977: Presentation for Colloquium for A.B. and A.M. candidates in Asian studies at Harvard, 20 participants.
- November 30, 1977: Karen Weisel installed as Director of The Japan Society.
- December 1, 1977: "Celebrations" Workshop attended by 30 teachers, community agency staff and education students.
- December 10, 1977: "Celebrations" Workshop. 32 Participants.

January 30, 1978:	Boston-Kyoto Sister City Foundation annual meeting.
March, 1978:	<u>Explorations: Japanese Culture</u> for 25 kids, 1 teacher. The Whittemore School, Waltham. 4 sessions.
March, 1978:	Girls' Day Festival Celebration.
March 29 - 31, 1978:	Conference for Outreach staff, Chicago, Illinois. 20-30 participants.
March 31 - April 2, 1978:	Association for Asian Studies meetings, Chicago, Illinois.

April 6 - May 18, 1978: Teaching About Japan, a 6-session course for teachers. Open registration.

May, 1978: Explorations: Japanese Culture for 25 kids, 1 teacher. The Whittemore School, Waltham. 4 sessions.

May, 1978: Boys' Day Festival Celebration.

May, 1978: Explorations: Japanese Culture for 75 kids, 3 teachers from Belmont Public Schools.

April - June, 1978: Summer Staff Training. 40 teachers attended The East Asian sections last year.
