
Special Education Field Trip:Call 426-6500 as soon as possible after Labor Day to make a reservation for your group. Wednesday mornings during the school year can be reserved for small groups of people with special needs, at which time staff will be available to tour the Museum on a one-to-one basis. There are no restrictions regarding age or severity of handicap. Although the Museum will be open to the public, there are no school field trip reservations on Wednesday mornings. This will allow your group the opportunity to explore the Museum with less noise and competition, and much more attention from our staff.

Community Group Reservations: All visits to the Children's Museum by organized, non-profit community groups in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts are sponsored by an appropriation from the Massachusetts Council on the Arts and Humanities.

The Museum will be available for reservations by community groups from 2:00 - 5:00 p.m. each weekday during the school year, and from 10:00 - 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays.
