I. Information and Program Update

- A. Career Education: Schools and ci's are now meeting to design the spring pilot projects.
- B. Humanities Training: Plans are being formulated for Year 2; applications for new participants will be ready by mid-April.
- C. Tri-Arts: Programs are going well. No data yet on the % of vouchers that are being redeemed. John Heseltine indicated that since the Marshall School has had a dance program for the past three years and many of the Marshall students go to the Cleveland, it would be interesting to note how the Cleveland's voucher tickets are used.
- D. Computer Information: Program will be piloted this summer with 16 school systems.

II. 636 Program

- A. Update: Over 60 schools have requested programs so far. Since the demand for programs appears to be far exceeding the limited allocation in each District, there will obviously be a problem in deciding what to fund and for how much.

Decision: It was decided that the Collaborative will ask each program director to submit estimated final budget figures for each program no later than Friday, March 24, 1978. The Collaborative will then compile this information and return it to program directors so they will be able to judge how their budgets (in total) relate to the District's allocation.

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B. Internal Review

Friday, April 7, 1978: Final proposals due at Collaborative
Monday, April 10, 1978: Collaborative delivers proposals to
District offices

Decision: It was decided that when the Collaborative contacts cultural institutions on April 4 about the recommendations from the internal review panel that the Collaborative indicate, if there are serious concerns of non-compliance with the Internal Guidelines. If the final proposal is submitted and still does not comply with those guidelines, the Collaborative will not coordinate that program. It may, however, be submitted on its own.
