

Session Descriptions



SESSION I It's Only a Paper Moon. A smorgasbord of paper projects for every age introduced by a host of Museum staff. Printing, marbling, stenciling, egg & milk carton creations, clever uses for newspaper, multicultural papercrafts, kites, bookmaking, and Boston by maps and quides.

SESSION II Choose one SCIENCE IN THE CITY: Projects kids can build - bughouses, nature craft, simple terrariums and hints at observing urban wildlife.

AFRICAN ARTS: Learn techniques of tie-dying; make and string clay

ARTS & CRAFTS FOR YOUNG CHILDREN: Bubbles, puppets, singing games, and simple crafts for under-fives.

SOFT IN THE HEAD: Make masks, beasts, puppets using RECYCLE foam. Learn the techniques for assembling sculpture.

SCIENCE IN YOUR LUNCH (an edible exhibit): Examine salad and chicken wings and then eat them; or bring your Big Mac and look inside.

> SESSION III Choose one SCIENCE IN THE CITY 2: See session II and add ant-farming and slice of pond--great observation set-ups.

> ETHNIC DISCOVERY: Explore your own cultural background and those of others with artifacts, language and games.

MUSIC MAKING: Learn snappy ways to get your group singing, dancing and playing instruments with the artists from Tribal Rhythms.

ARTS & CRAFTS SAMPLER: 10 activities designed for 6-12 year olds, and ideas about why you do what when.

SESSION IV The Quiet Hours. Late afternoon wind-down with presentations about available resources, browsing through "study" areas, and a storytelling session. Visit the Museum of Transportation and the Tea Party Ship. Watch a

SESSION V Family Night. Delegates are invited to bring their families to this evening session. Visit the Exhibit Center or join in scheduled events in the Resource Center: put together a Babysitter's Survival Kit; play group games, hear our ideas for family albums and trees, dress up in old clothes and (for a small fee) have a polaroid portrait, discuss with us some issues about working with adolescents.

SESSION VI Choose one workshop and then join us for the Grand Finale. DRESS UP & MAKE UP: While you gather ideas to use with kids, create an outrageous new "you" with a wacky hat, decorated face, improvised glad rags.

AN URBAN NEIGHBORHOOD WALK: Explore local history and architecture by examining area buildings and streets with museum staff. Ideas for doing neighborhood observation with children.

MUSIC MAKING: See session III and get ready for the Grand Finale

TRADITIONAL DRESS: Learn to wrap a sari, try on a kimono, examine clothes from Armenian, Chinese, African, Japanese, Hmong, Indian and Native American folks.

GRANDE FINALE: Splendid April Foolishness with Tribal Rhythms, Museum staff, and all your new colleagues.

WHAT IF I CAN'T GET A SITTER ON FRIDAY NIGHT?


Friday is Family Night. Bring the whole bunch. Additional meal tickets can be had for \$2; if you wish to have them eat beforehand, they can join you for free.
