
Alef-Bet: Exploring Jewish Traditions

Exploration of five themes of Jewish traditional life: Torah, Hebrew Calligraphy, Passover, the Jewish Calendar, and Israel.




House of Ancient Greece

Simulation of actual archeological villa excavation, reconstructing through artifacts everyday life in Ancient Greece.




Medieval People

Enactment of episodes in the life of a medieval manor using character descriptions, costumes, and props. (e.g. falconary gear, psalter)




Printing Press

Complete production of a book: writing, editing, printing and binding. Portable press, type, block print materials, complete instructions.




Animal Camouflage

Examination of camouflage principles using a shadow box, model animals, mounted insects and dioramas.




Houses

Exploration of the impact of physical environment on living patterns by comparison of Eskimo igloo and Nigerian mud thatch house models.




Musical Shapes and Sounds

Relationship of the shapes of instruments and the sounds they produce with real instruments, photos, and recordings. Pipes for constructing own instruments.




Roots

Explaining seed growth and dispersal through examination and experimentation with fruits and seeds.




The City

Introduction of the relationship between the life and forms of the city with building, models, maps, films, and recordings.




Imagination Unlimited

Individual observation, creative interpretation and expression stimulated by unique multi-media materials.




Netsilik Eskimos

Seal hunt simulation and exploration of a traditional Eskimo lifestyle with authentic tools, clothing and other artifacts.




Seeds

Experiments with growth and dispersal of seeds through examination and exploring with fruits and seeds.




Echoes of China

Exploration of Chinese architecture, art, celebrations, games, geography, history, and Chinese-American culture through activities. (For individual units see Exhibit and Study Kits sections.)




Indians who met the Pilgrims

Introduction to traditional and contemporary Wampanoag lifestyles through crafts, artifacts, personal statements and seasonal food.



New England Indian Ash Splint Basketry

Study of a continuing tradition through slides, tools, baskets, and oral history.



Waterplay

Play and experimentation with water using tubs, vessels, tubes and water systems.




Grouping Birds

Multi-dimensional media approach to classification using birds for sorting and grouping according to physical adaptations and behavior.




Japanese Family

Exploration of family life in Japan through role playing with household items, clothing and family history records.



Paddle-to-the-Sea

The story of the Great Lakes trip by "Paddle" recreated using replicas of Indian travel materials, trade items and maps.



What If You Couldn't?

A program about handicaps -- emotional problems, hearing impairments, learning disabilities, orthopedic problems, mental retardation, visual impairments -- using simulations, role playing cards and disability aids. (For pairs of units see Study Kits section.)
