
Multi-media kits on physical sciences, natural history, arts and crafts, and social studies developed by the Boston Children's Museum educational specialists, have been circulated to schools and community groups in the Boston area for many years. These kits vary in format from comprehensive curriculum units with structured lesson plans, to collections of artifacts, pictures, and labels. All offer participatory learning experiences for preschool, elementary, and junior high school students.

Now, a satellite center for distribution of kits from the Children's Museum has been established at the Hitchcock Center for the Environment in Amherst. Kits can be obtained with greater ease through this cooperative program which provides increased availability to the Western Massachusetts region. Kits may be picked up at the Hitchcock Center where you can take advantage of other supplemental resources. Kits can also be shipped via United Parcel Service.

# CURRICULUM UNITS

Rental -- \$40 Duration -- 3 weeks

Extensive multi-media kits with artifacts, books, audio-visual materials, models, activity ideas and supplies. Guide with structured lesson plans for a complete 2 to 3 week study.

- 1. ANIMAL CAMOUFLAGE\* Examination of camouflage principles using a shadow box, model animals, mounted insects and dioramas.
- 2. HOUSES\* Exploration of the impact of physical environment on living patterns by comparison of Eskimo igloo and Nigerian mud thatch house models.
- 3. PADDLE-TO-THE-SEA\* The story of the Great Lakes trip by "Paddle" recreated using replicas of Indian travel materials, trade items, and maps.

- 4. PRINTING PRESS\* Complete production of a book: writing, editing, printing and binding. Portable press, type, block print materials, complete
- 5. ROCKS\* Exploration of natural rock formation process using rock and fossil specimens.
